**Afternoon: Progress Reports Cultivate Projects**

Welcome note by Lucky/Madeleine. Lucky is in charge of the meeting.

Progress Report: Helle

Helle discusses the Dürer-project that the group will deal with in a session tomorrow. She mentions how she would be interested in turning the Dürer-project into a book project, involving members of the CULTIVATE-group but perhaps also others. There is a brief discussion on the matter, but no conclusion is reached on the project, and it is left for further discussion at tomorrow's individual presentations of the Dürer project (aka: 'The Rhinoceros Project').

Helle furthermore mentions an application for HERA JRP Knowledge Transfer and Networking activities. She is planning a two-day event on "Copyright, digitization and the humanities: Who owns what (and why should we care)?" The event will take place in Copenhagen, Denmark on June 11 and 12, 2012 if the funding is granted. The application will be sent in later this month.

Helle has been spending the fall term in Cambridge as an Arcadia Fellow, Wolfson College, University of Cambridge. Her output as a Fellow will be an article, and she intends to write on 'digital humanities' (DH) and the wish on the part of DH scholars to bridge the gap between the humanities and the sciences and technology. She talks about how interested she has become in DH and 'The Digital Scholar'. She mentions her new blog and how that relates to the role of the academic; to become a digital humanities scholar in practice, not just in theory.

Helle also mentions that she has been approached by Ashgate Publishers about publishing the outcome of the final CULTIVATE conference at the Tate Modern in 2013.

The group discusses whether such a project could give problems, as HERA has set out a prerequisite on open access to all outputs from its research projects, that does not entirely match with the publisher's policy of copyright of its published material.

Eva has doubts about the term 'digital humanities' and Helle gives a further explanation of her impression of the topic and its importance.

Again, no clear conclusion is reached.
